Once editing has been completed, these clips will then be shared with other schools across New Zealand. Clarkville was one of eight schools selected nationally to share teaching practice and only the only Kura from Canterbury. I am really proud of our great teaching staff and the dedication they display towards their students and their learning. The recordings should be available on the Ministry of Education website in the near future and then will be sent out to schools. I will share a hyperlink to the recordings so parents/caregivers and our students can access the content when I am able to do so - I'm sure some teachers will play certain aspects of the recordings with their children in their learning spaces. Some of our tamariki will be excited to be famous!
