We also welcome two new staff members - Mitchell Bailey, Team Leader in our Year $7 / 8$ Wairaki space and Jaimee Keys, Year 3/4 teacher in Horotueka space. Thank you to the children and the community for making them both feel so welcome.

Starting back with a three day school week and then with Week 2 featuring a Teacher Only Day on Mon 5 Feb and Waitangi Day on Tues 6 Feb is certainly allowing everyone to ease back into routines. Please remember this term has 11 weeks as we have the Easter break before the end of the term. All New Zealand primary schools must be open for instruction for a set amount of days but there is some choice on start and end days depending on what might suit best. Children, especially young ones, can struggle with tiredness as they get used to longer school days where they are required to really concentrate after a long summer break. Two of my sons (aged 6 and 9) were very tired and crabby at the end of yesterday - we are going to bring their bedtimes forward half an hour as they always get up at the same time in the morning anyway!

## Teacher Only Day

Just another reminder that we have a Teacher Only Day on Monday 5 February. We will be meeting as a staff with St Patrick's Kaiapoi to work with Literacy Connections, a professional learning provider. Our focus for the day is to further strengthen our well-established structured literacy practice. I hope our families enjoy the long weekend with Waitangi Day on Tuesday :)

## Uniform

Our new uniform is being worn by many students and the new logo looks amazing! Please remember, the old uniform is still able to be worn for the foreseeable future and is still for sale through the PTA's secondhand uniform shop.

There is one new uniform item that has been introduced at the start of this year - navy blue socks! When the School Board consulted the school community in 2023, approximately $35 \%$ of parents/caregivers were in favour of navy blue socks, approximately $35 \%$ were in favour of either navy blue or plain white socks and approximately $30 \%$ were not keen on socks being part of the uniform. The School Board felt it was quite clear that having a specific sock colour as part of the uniform was popular (and looks really smart). They decided on the plain navy option as most white socks often have logos and didn't want staff to have to determine whether a white sock was plain or not.

Aly Maclean stocks beautiful NZ made navy school socks in a 3-pack for $\$ 21$ or alternatively, navy school socks are usually available from Kmart, The Warehouse or Postie Plus and are very reasonably priced.

Please also be aware that navy shorts or trackpants featuring logos (like the Canterbury ones) are not part of our school uniform. Navy shorts (and culottes) or trackpants must either be plain (old uniform or with Clarkville School written on them) or with the new logo available through Aly Maclean's website.

## School Pool

The school pool will only be available for school community members who would like to purchase a key for WEEKDAYS ONLY and after 3.30pm. The school is required to test the water quality each school day as our children are using it, but a qualified member of staff is not able to test the water quality over weekends. Pool keys will be available for purchase by school community members for $\$ 30$ with an added bond of $\$ 20$ refunded at the end of the season with the return of the security fob and key. Free Dental Care for Children including special information regarding Year 8 students

One of our Community Dental Service vans will be making a visit to your school soon.

- Only the children who currently require a check-up will be seen at this visit. Please do not be concerned if your child is not called for a check-up this time.
- The dental therapist will provide a regular check-up and preventative care which may include:

Cleaning/Scaling (to remove plaque from teeth]
Dental $x$-rays (to check for decay in teeth, or presence and position of teeth)
Fluoride Varnish (painted on teeth to help prevent decay)
Fissure Sealants (coating put on teeth to prevent decay) if required.

- If your child requires any other dental care, they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as vou will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of cour Comm unity Clinics for this dental care.
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care fa dental therapist will call you back.
- Year 8 students: all year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from year 9 until their $18^{\text {th }}$ birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their year 8 check-up.
