#### **KAIAPOI LEARNING SPACE ENTRANCE**

If you happen to walk past Kaiapoi Year 5/6 learning space you will notice a new deck and entrance area. The previous ramp and shelter were very old and were well past 'end of life'. Tasked with raising money to build a new deck and entrance area, our wonderful PTA have been working quietly behind the scenes to make this a reality.

What we wanted was a 'soft' area for children to sit and play, rather than something hard and cold like asphalt. Somewhere where children could play cards, chess or colour- in during their class breaks.

One of our parents, Landscape Architect Leonard Wall, kindly designed and perfected the plans to meet the needs of the school. This meant that the project now could be visualised.

A massively generous donation of all the timber and materials required to build the deck was an incredibly kind gesture from one of our parents from VIP Trade.

The PTA then raised funds over the past 12 months from various projects to ensure that the deck could be constructed. Local builder and parent Simon Ansley was tasked with this and has done a wonderful job!

Thank you to the PTA, VIP Trade, Leonard and all of the other parents/caregivers involved with getting this project 'across the line'. Thank you also to our students and their whanau over the past 12 months to raise enough funds through PTA initiatives. Clarkville, and especially our Kaiapoi Year 5/6 learning space now has an amazing entrance and deck area for children to enjoy for many years to come.

#### ONE DAY WINTER SPORT TOURNAMENT

Congratulations to all the Year 5-8 students who represented the school at the One Day Winter Sport Tournament last week. Students from Clarkville formed Netball, Hockey and Football teams to compete against other North Canterbury Schools. Final results, placings and countbacks are now being evaluated as both Pegasus and Rakahuri Zones competed together as 'North Canterbury'. Final placings and further opportunities for teams to attend Canterbury Champs will be announced when we have this information. Well done to our students who attended this event to compete for Clarkville - feedback from teachers was that you all displayed good team spirit and fair play while competing to the best of your ability and playing in a determined manner to achieve good results.

### **NZEI UNION MEETING**

Thank you to our parents/caregivers who supported our teachers to attend their union meeting last Thursday. Teachers are contractually entitled to attend x2 union meetings annually during school hours, although those in Primary education very rarely use this opportunity. Despite what Government Ministers are stating publicly, I can assure you that no Primary school teacher in New Zealand earns anything close to \$147,000 annually! For that matter, no Secondary School teacher earns anything close to that either! While there is base salary parity between Primary and Secondary School teachers, Secondary Schools receive a much higher number of units (worth \$5000 each for Secondary or \$4500 each for Primary) than Primary Schools do per student. This can

result in Secondary School teachers being paid significantly more for accepting extra responsibilities than their Primary colleagues. Despite this, only Deputy Principals of very, very large Secondary Schools (think over x2000 students) 'might' earn anything near this amount. Once a teacher reaches the 'top of the scale' without accepting any extra responsibilities, the annual maximum salary for a teacher with a four year University Degree is \$103,086. It usually takes a teacher about 11 years of service to reach this max salary amount. Primary Teachers, as part of their negotiations, have requested greater support for the learning and behavioural needs of students so that all get the best public education that they deserve. The Government has offered teachers 1% pay increase a year over the next three years and tried to remove some favourable conditions from their collective contracts. Both Primary and Secondary teachers have rejected these offers. Thank you to the Clarkville community for the continued support of our amazing teachers!


